Short Syllabus

Course description

This course studies spiritual formation. Participation is required in an online three-day retreat that presents students with the opportunity to come to know God more intimately through silence, solitude, meditative prayer, communion, worship, and other spiritually formative activities. This retreat experience is informed by a study of the dynamic of these practices as they relate to Scripture and the call of the Triune God to know him better.

Estimated workload: For a student to do well in this course, the student will need to invest a total of 145 hours, or about 12 hours per week of reading, participating on the website, and writing papers.

Additional Fee Information:

An additional fee of \$125.00 will be required for participation in the required online retreat provided by Odyssey in Christ. The dates and time of the retreat will be determined, based on student availability, during the first week of class. Details on how to pay this fee will be supplied to students after course registration. Details will also be supplied about an optional, in-person retreat from November 14th to November 17th in Hickory, NC, which can be used to fulfill class requirements in lieu of the online retreat attendance.

Any additional required reading will be supplied by the instructor through the student learning portal.

Requirements and assignments

1. **Attend the Odyssey in Christ Retreat.** Students must participate in a three-day, online retreat, hosted by Odyssey in Christ. Participation in the retreat requires an additional fee and completion of pre-retreat reading and an assessment, and post-retreat reading and writing assignments. This counts for 30 percent of the final grade.
2. **Read the lessons.** Lessons (lectures and related reading/audio visual material) will be posted each Monday for the first eight weeks, and then the week following the retreat.

3. **Participate.** In most courses, part of the learning that occurs comes through discussion and interaction with other students. In an online class, this is done through comments posted on a discussion forum. This counts for 20 percent of the final grade.
4. **Video Conference.** Participate in a 3-hour online group video conference with course instructor. Date and time to be arranged in consultation with instructor. This counts for 5 per cent of your final grade.
5. **Read the textbooks.** They total about 900 pages, or about 80 pages each week.
6. **Write Four Reaction Papers.** This counts for 20 percent of the final grade. We estimate that you will need about 32 hours to work on these papers – an average of 3 hours per week – some weeks more, some less.
7. **Final Paper.** This paper may take about 15 hours, and counts for 25 percent of the final grade.
